1986 – A momentous and memorable year for soccer in Canada with the appearance on the world’s stage in Mexico. The players under the astute direction of Tony Waiters acquitted themselves well on the field. Things were also happening off the pitch.

A team of staff coaches under the direction of the new Technical Director were conducting an in-depth analysis of all the teams in the tournament. The result was the unique SOCCER 2000 concept aimed at addressing weaknesses in the Canadian game. Two pocket sized manuals were produced and distributed in clinics across the country in 1988 and 1989. A video was also produced in 1991 using footage from the Canadian Soccer League and was shown on TSN’s popular Soccer Saturday show.

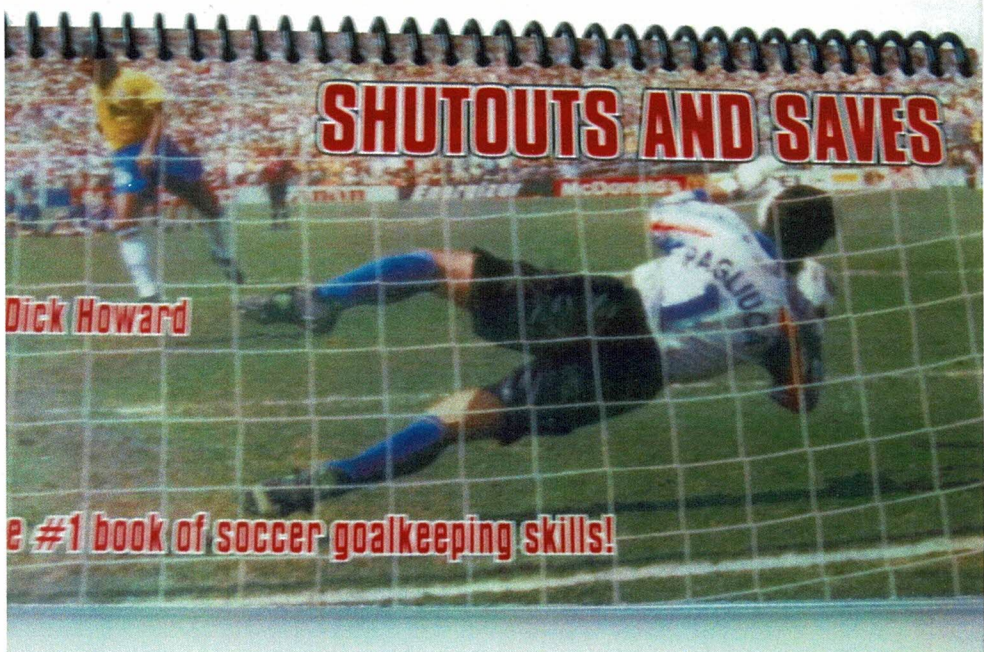
Consideration was also given to the grassroots game with another initiative by the CSA Technical Department. The Mini Soccer manual and video was produced in 1988 for coaches of under 10 year old players and included great illustrations by Bill Suddick, a fellow “Beacher” in Toronto.

1996 resulted in two publications.

“Shutouts and saves -- the Number 1 book of soccer goalkeeping skills” was a pocket-sized manual aimed at goalkeepers and their coaches. This from a goalkeeper who was self taught and my legacy for Number 1’s. It followed numerous clinics across the country over the years, the Goalkeepers Academy as well as a period as Canada’s first National Goalkeeping coach.

“Soccer, Diving Headers, Selling a Dummy and Everything Else about the Game” was an entirely different publication aimed at newcomers to the game and the result of a friendship with noted cartoonist Ben Wicks.

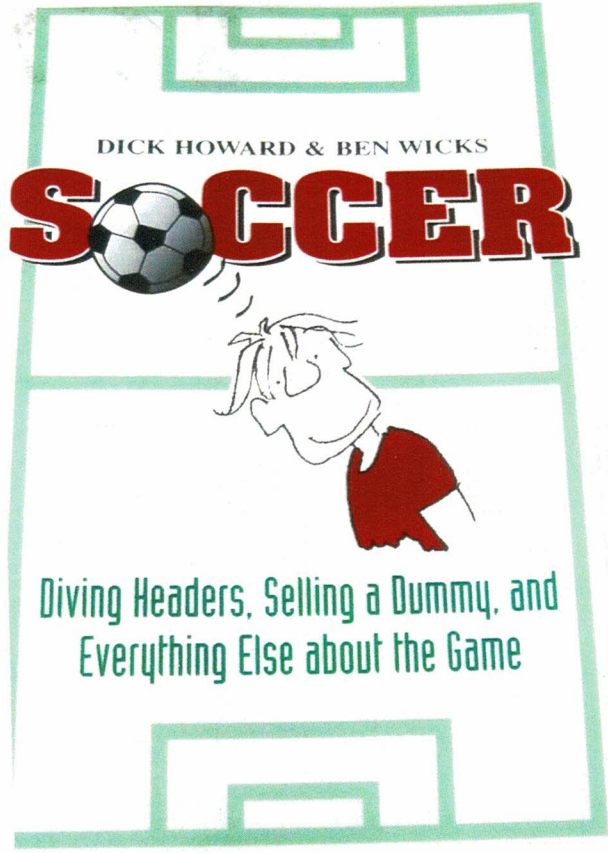

Joseph "Sepp" Blatter joined FIFA in 1975 as technical director became general secretary in 1981 and served as FIFA President from 1998 until 2015

The following notes came from the meetings of the FIFA Technical Committee (1999-2012)*

The FIFA President never missed a meeting of "one of the most important committees in FIFA ". He always enjoyed the discussions on the technical aspects of the game with his vision
.....DEVELOP THE GAMETOUCH THE WORLDBUILD A BETTER FUTURE

Sepp Blatter was truly the first FIFA missionary implementing coordinated development programs around the world through his personal favourite, the innovative GOAL project. He was proud of the fact that "there is no difference between big and small countries"...especially true in Africa.

In fact when he joined FIFA in 1975 the only FIFA competitions were the World Cup and the Olympic Games. Now an expanded World Cup provides the financial resources for twelve other competitions as well as a wide range of development projects and courses on all aspects of the game... A budget of \$771 million in a recent four year period! In a 2003 meeting he still regarded himself as the "skill development officer of FIFA".

He especially enjoyed the days when the technical committee and the football committee Pele, Beckenbauer, et al, "the crème de la crème" held joint meetings to discuss the state of the game.

A true football man his legacy regarding the development of the world's game during his 40 years with FIFA is unmatched in the world of sports.....it should not be forgotten

A special event:

The FIFA President showed off his football skills in a pick-up game in the grounds of a Lagos hotel in the morning of the final game of the FIFA Under20 World Cup in 1999. A formidable team that included D.H., Swiss International Jean -Paul Brigger, and the great Michel Platini who went on to be the Chairman of the Technical Committee as well as being a special advisor to the FIFA President.

PHASE 1: 1966-67 HEADMASTERS: TED SENIOR / BILL BURRIDGE

It all started with an article in the TIMES Educational Supplement. Wanted: P.E. teacher at Crescent School, Toronto, Canada, for the princely sum of \$4400 per annum.

Left at the end of the year to play professional soccer with Hamilton Primos.

PHASE 2: 1972-86 HEADMASTERS: CHRIS GORDON / JOHN TANSEY

After the trade from Rochester to Toronto taught for one year at RJ Lang JHS in North York then returned to Crescent in a new location on Bayview Avenue. CBG supported a wide ranging sports program with an emphasis on soccer. It soon bore results with the Upper School First team winning seven Championships in a 14 year period starting in 1974. A feature of the program was the exchange trips with East HS in Rochester New York. Played for the Toronto Metros whilst teaching. The school also allowed the Technical Director to be a member of the coaching staff of the National Team in a World Cup Qualifying Tournament in Honduras in 1981 The lure of full time employment in the game was too much however and resulted in a move to become Technical Director of the Canadian Soccer Association in 1986.

PHASE 3: 2008-14 HEADMASTERS: GEOFF ROBERTS / MICHAEL FELLIN

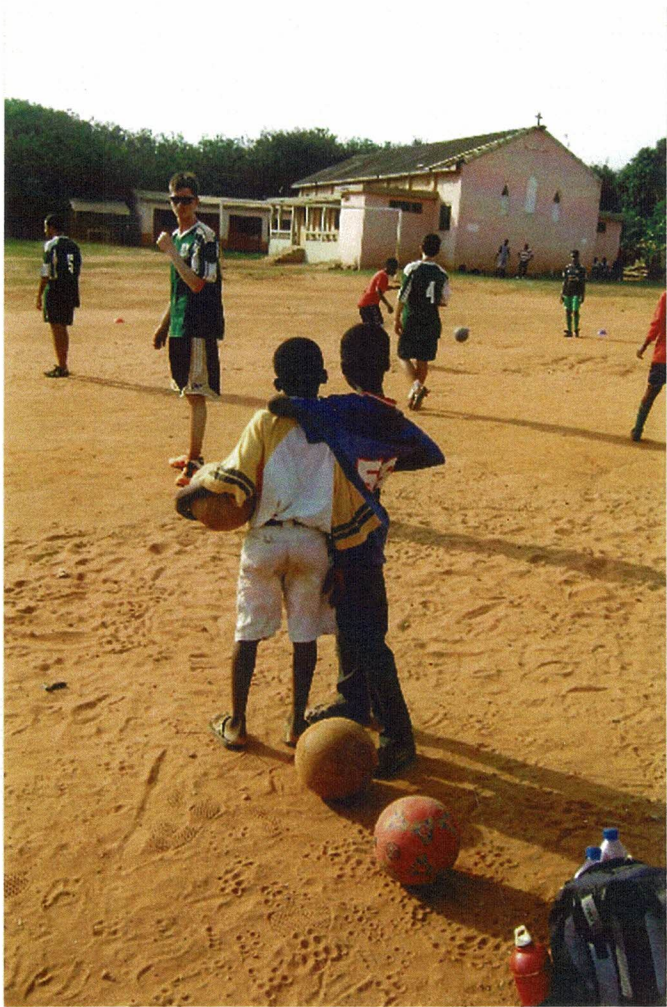
Consultant on POLYTAN Project which resulted in the construction of a FIFA TWO STAR field along with floodlights. Innes Field is now the home of POWER SOCCER one of the top academies in Canada. A 5-year development program was implemented at the school.

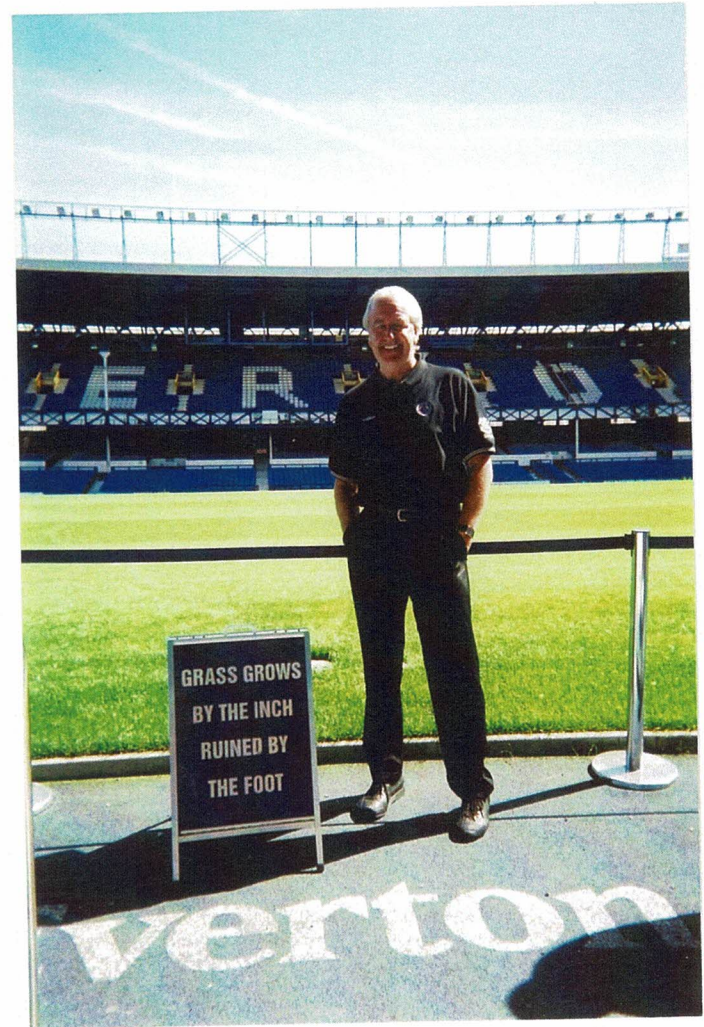
A lifelong supporter of the “Toffees”, so a trip to Merseyside with the Ontario Under 15 team In August, 2007 was too good to miss. My capacity: Chairman off the OSA Technical Committee. A full schedule included a visit to USM Finch Farm one of the finest training facilities in the world; trips to watch professional teams in action; and four games in 8 days with a 2-1-1 record against local club teams. The real highlight of the trip, however, was a memorable game against a combined Everton under 15/ 16 team when a 3-0 score-line for the visitors at half time prompted an Everton fan to comment that “ these Canadians know how to play football (soccer)” ... the game finished 4-4.

GOODISON PARK

The trip also included a visit to “the school of science” aka Goodison Park. The iconic stadium, 125 years old in 2017, was the first purpose built football stadium in the world. It brought back fond memories of trips with my grandfather and my uncle Arthur to see the blues in action. It certainly helped that the Kettlewell family had season tickets in the Gladwy’s Street stand.

DAVE HICKSON

One of my favourite players over the years was Dave Hickson nicknamed “The Cannonball Kid”, because of his shooting ability. He was a much loved Evertonian and a popular club ambassador. The blond-haired centre-forward was also one of a few post-war footballers to play on all three sides of the Mersey with Everton, Liverpool and Tranmere Rovers. Brought up in Ellesmere Port he played for the local town team in his later years. On October 30th 1965, it brought him up against Dick Howard and his Chester Reserve teammates. The Cheshire league game resulted in a surprise 1-0 win and a memorable shutout for the recent graduate from Chester College.

INTERVIEW AT VARSITY STADIUM IN 1998

IT HAPPENED OVER 60 YEARS AGO.

The flickering black and white images on the small screen were a revelation to the 10 year old. The individual skills, teamwork and overall play of a Hungarian team that was later to be called "The Marvellous Magyars" was also mesmerizing for an England team that had never lost by such a margin, 6-3, on English soil to another team from outside the British Isles. It happened in 1953 and it was to change my whole outlook on the beautiful game.

It was however the athleticism and technical skills of goal keeper Gyula Grosics, "The Black Panther", that made the biggest impression on an enthusiastic young goalkeeper already starting to be a student of the game. No goalkeeper coaches to develop my skills, instead a book entitled "Learn to play the Hungarian way" became my resource book. This for long hours of informal training: in my own little stadium in the back garden; in the school playground; and on the local playing field.

I even dressed in black like my hero as I followed his career closely until his retirement. Imagine my delight when I met the dapper 72 year old Grosics in 1998 on a visit to Toronto with some of the other remaining members of the team to celebrate the anniversary of that memorable match. A great admirer of Gordon Banks and Lev Yashin amongst others, he outlined his role as an early version of a "sweeper keeper" playing as a libero behind the defence, combined with the need to control the penalty area and direct the defence, all ironically key components of modern goalkeeper training. Grosics who passed away in 2014 at the age of 88 will never be forgotten.

IN CONCLUSION:

Study the top players either in person or on TV and watch them closely to see what makes them great... learn the lessons especially from players who play in your position... then go out and practice to improve your own skills in all aspects of the game ... the game is a great teacher.

HONDURAS '81

CANADA 2 CUBA 2ONE GOAL AWAY FROM THE 1982 WORLD CUP IN SPAIN.

Honduras figured prominently with regards to World Cup Qualifying in 1981 and 1985.

2 - 21.11.1981: Final Qualifying Tournament in Tegucigalpa Honduras.

A 2-2 tie in the final game against Cuba meant that the Canadian National Team had narrowly failed to qualify for the 1982 World Cup in Spain. This after the team had tied 1-1 against Haiti and Mexico and had defeated El Salvador 1-0. The only loss, 2-1, was in a controversial game against the host country.

It was a disappointing end to what had been an impressive qualifying campaign. In the previous round the team had a win and a tie against the USA and had tied both games against Mexico. The 1-1 tie in front of 90,000 fans in the mighty Azteca came courtesy of a marvelous free kick goal by Gerry Gray. The experienced squad, 21/22 players were with NASL teams, benefitted from the sponsorship of Labatts. This enabled them to have an ideal preparation period and an extended series of games that ranged from National Teams to the New York Cosmos.

So near yet so far for coach Barrie Clarke who had taken the Under 20 National team to its first ever FIFA Under20 World Cup in Japan in 1979.

14.09.1985: Final Qualifying game in St. John's, Newfoundland.

A dramatic 2-1 win over Honduras before 7,000 enthusiastic fans in the King George V Playing Field.Canada had qualified for its first ever World Cup in Mexico 1986.

It was a remarkable achievement given that only 4 out of the 22 players were playing with club teams. 9 players were with indoor teams and the remaining 9 players did not even have a club and were under contract with the Canadian Soccer Association. It certainly limited the preparation time for the team and gives great credit to coach Tony Waiters who had taken the nucleus of the team to the quarter finals of the Los Angeles Olympics in 1984....only losing out to Brazil on penalty kicks.

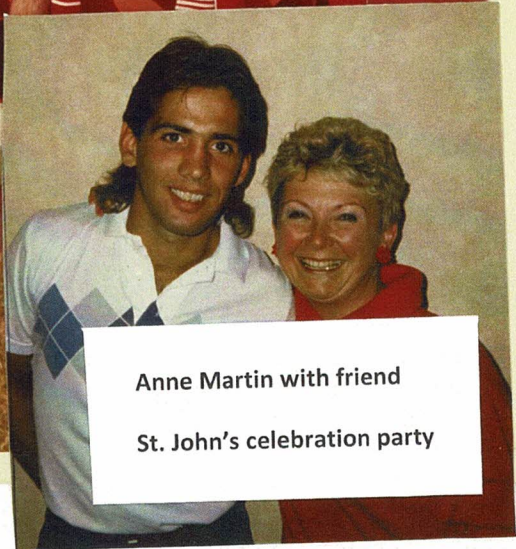
The team acquitted itself well in Mexico especially in the opening game a 1-0 defeat against Michel Platini and the European champions, France. The two remaining games were both 2-0 defeats against Hungary and USSR.

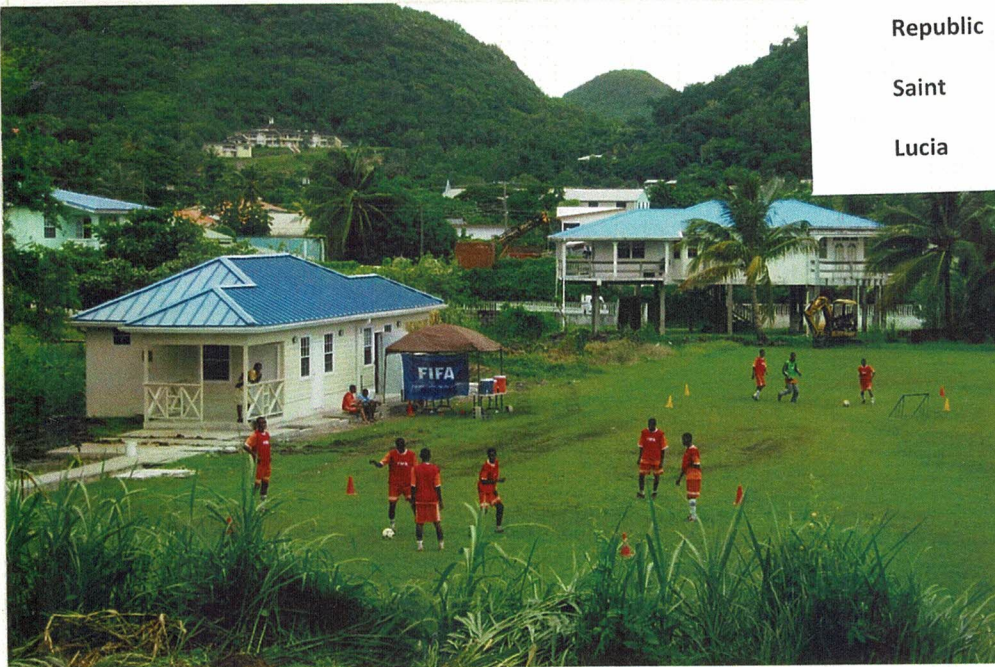

1968: DETROIT COUGARS.

2000: UNDER 20 WORLD CUP QUALIFYING TOURNAMENT.

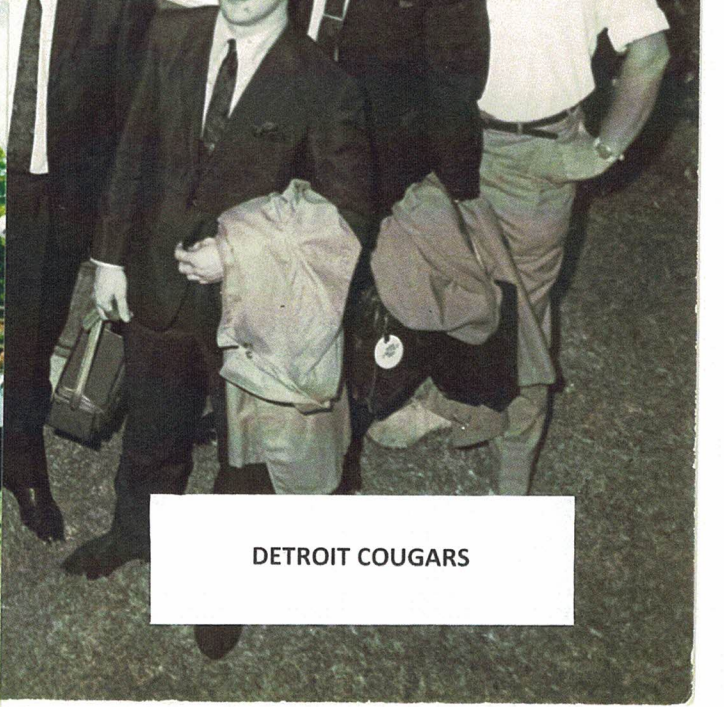
A memorable trip for the Under20 team of Dominica -- The team finished second to a strong Jamaican Team that qualified for the FIFA Under20 tournament in Argentina. The team beat BVI 5-0 and Grenada 3-1 before losing 2-0 to the host country. Another highlight was a trip to the Bob Marley Museum in Kingston following the tournament.

FIRST FIFA PROJECT...COURSE FOR GOALKEEPER COACHES IN 1988

October 1988 and Kuwait became the location for my first ever FIFA coaching course.

It was to be a two day journey of 14,000 miles crossing 10 time zones.

All this because the National Goalkeeping coach was in Mexico City in a preparation camp for the Under 16 National Team that was to qualify for the FIFA Under 16 World Cup in Scotland in 1989.

The early morning departure from Mexico City arrived in Toronto via Chicago in time to connect with the daily BA 72 flight to London, Heathrow. Time for some sleep before boarding Kuwait Airways #172 to Kuwait City... and things got interesting. The pilot just happened to be a member of the Kuwait FA, knew about my situation and as a result invited me to join him on the flight deck (certainly not possible today!) He even brought in commentary of an English League game to make me feel at home. Needless to say it was still good to finally land and get to bed at 8.00 pm... a special jet lag plan* certainly helped in this regard.

The week long course for goalkeeper coaches was well received by all the participants with some relaxing time to check out the sights and sounds of this interesting country.

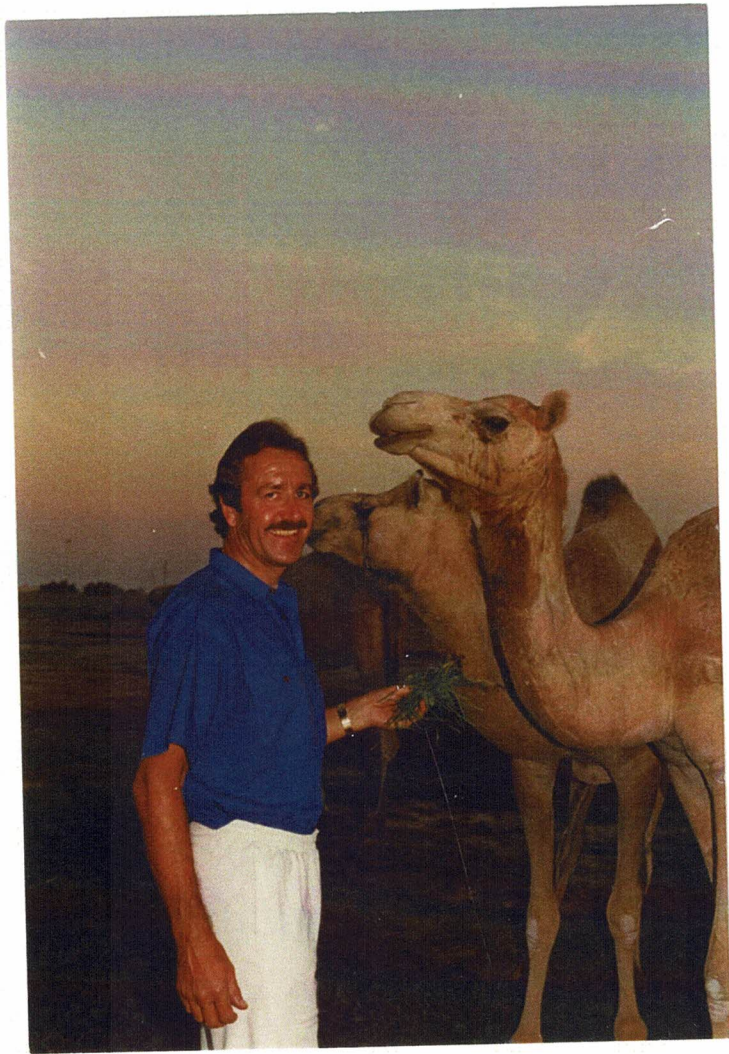
It was also nice to spend some time with the Renton family on the hill on the return trip to Canada.

Another long journey in August 1993: Toronto to Sydney via Los Angeles and Honolulu, this time to cover, for TSN, an important World Cup Qualifying play-off game between Australia and Canada. The teams finished all square 3-3 so extra time was required in Sydney. Only one problem nobody in Canada had booked air time in the possibility of added time. Fortunately yours truly was able to provide commentary on his cell phone until normal programming was restored in time for the penalty kicks. Canada lost out 4-1.

'Toronto Metros were hosting Santos of Brazil in Toronto. Pele lined up to take a penalty kick. The goalkeeper should perhaps have been preparing himself to face the greatest goal-scorer in the world. Instead he held his arm out, walked up to his opponent, shook his handwished him "good luck".

The goalkeeper was Canadian International and now respected commentator Dick Howard. It was an attempt to unsettle Pele, psych him out, disrupt his concentration. It didn't work.

Pele scored –and then went up to Dick, gently ruffled his hair and good naturedly said words to the effect. "I've scored over 1000 goals. I've seen everything. Nothing phases me"

Santos won 4-2.

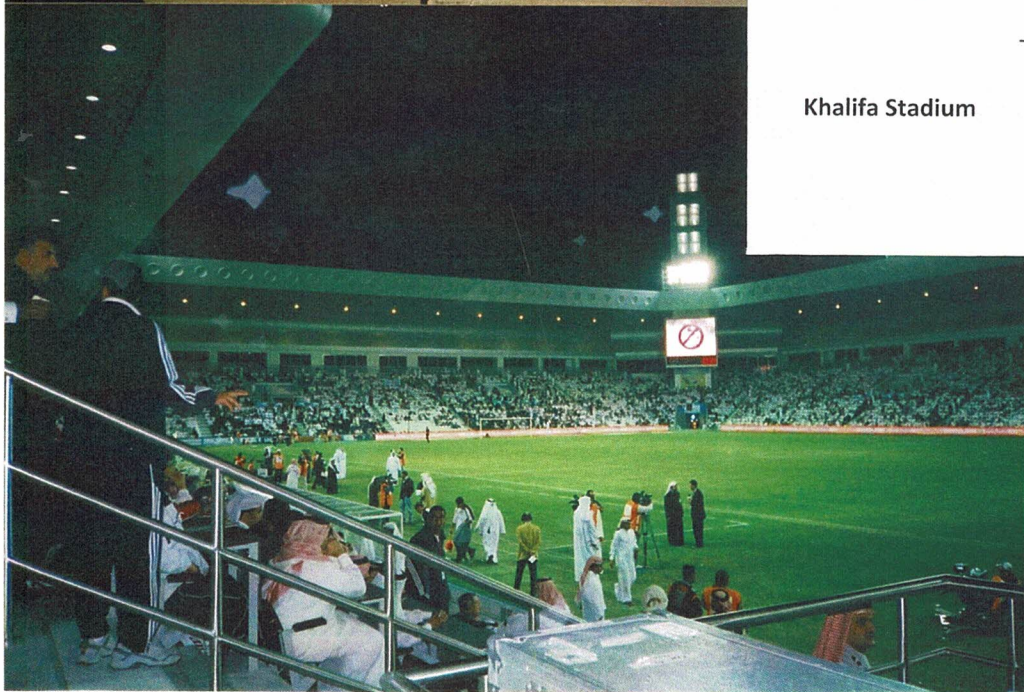

1970 NASL CHAMPIONS...2010 REUNION

1967:

The start of a long term love affair with the city of Rochester, New York began in the fall of 1967 with an invitation from two Scottish soccer playing friends, Charlie Mitchell and Davie Thomson, who had been invited to play by the Rochester Lancers team that had just joined the American Soccer League. It was certainly beneficial to Dick Howard. A strong performance in a 2-1 win over a talented Washington Darts team was witnessed by Len Julians, coach of the Detroit Cougars. It resulted in a contract with the team that was set to play in the North American Soccer League in 1968.

1968-70

"Mr. Zero" returned to Rochester following the demise of the Cougars at the end of the 1968 season and stayed for the next two years. The Lancers reached the play offs in the 1969 American Soccer League season and along with eternal rivals from Washington joined the NASL in 1970 (a move that "saved the new league). The Lancers were to play in the league until 1980 but it was the 1970 season that was to be remarkable in that the newcomers came out on top it was great to be part of a talented team that included former team mates Charlie Mitchell and Davie Thomson.

1971 - present.

The trade to the Toronto Metros resulted in some competitive games until the mid '70's..... It also started a rivalry between two schools with the move to Crescent School in Toronto..... the annual tournament involving East High School (coached by Vic Carlsen) and the trip to Rochester was always much anticipated by players on both teams.

The relationship has continued over the years with visits to Rochester to see the Raging Rhinos (now the Rhinos) in action against the Toronto Lynx and TFC 2 (the reserve team of Toronto FC).... Add in games involving the great stars of the women's game such as Marta and Christine Sinclair as well as games involving the indoor Lancers... it was always worth the three hour trip around the lake.

Recent trips have been linked with reunions. The 2010 event celebrated the 40th anniversary of the 1970 Championship team whilst the 2017 event honored the 50 years of the Lancers... Mr. Zero was inducted into the Lancers Hall of Fame in 2013
